



Year 4 Spellings – Spring 1

These words are the words you need to be able to spell for this half term and are from the spelling rules you are learning in school. Spellings are separated into weekly objectives; this allows you to follow the same sequence of learning at home as in school. You need to learn the rules and patterns to become more confident at spelling these words. A little practice every couple of days will help you to learn them off by heart; we will review how you've got on at the end of the half term.

Remember to use the saying:
Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check

<u>Week 1</u> Words with a /shuhn/ sound, spelt with 'sion' (if root word ends in 'se', 'de' or 'd')	<u>Week 2</u> Words with a /shuhn/ sound, spelt with 'ssion' (if root word ends in 'ss' or 'mit')	<u>Week 3</u> Words with a /shuhn/ sound, spelt with 'tion' (if root word ends in 'te' or 't' / or has no definite root)	<u>Week 4</u> Words with a /shuhn/ sound, spelt with 'cian' (if root word ends in 'c' or 'cs')	<u>Week 5</u> Words with 'ough' to make a long /o/, /oo/ or /or/ sound	<u>Week 6</u> Statutory Spellings Challenge Words
